A place for many firsts for Albemarle County

In 1937, the Crozet Volunteer Fire Department had the county's first brand new custom pumper, a 1937 Seagrave, bought and delivered to the fire department by train car. In the early 1960's, the fire department took delivery of their first self-contained breathing apparatus from Sutton & Clark in Richmond, Virginia. Crozet was the first to use 1½" hose for fire attack which moved away from the high pressure apparatus—one of the first to do so. In 1992, Crozet was one of the first to have Class A foam piped into a brush truck for more effective wildland firefighting. Today, the Crozet Volunteer Fire Department continues to lead the way for new technology. In 2003, the station took delivery of a new pumper with some of the newest technology available to firefighters—a Compressed Air Foam System (CAFS).

While buildings, apparatus, and technology have changed, the high quality services the Crozet VFD provide to the community haven't. We invite you to visit the station and meet many generations of western Albemarle residents who continue to provide volunteer emergency services to Crozet and the surrounding area.



Appreciating Our History

Crozet Volunteer Fire Department has a long history of service to the community that dates back to 1910 when it was established as one of the first fire departments in Albemarle County. In 1925, the fire department reorganized and was housed in a two-bay station on Crozet Avenue. In 1965, the department moved to a new brick building next door, which now houses the Western Albemarle Rescue Squad. The current station facility on Three Notch'd Road was constructed in 1985.

Communities Served

The Crozet Volunteer Fire Department serves the 14,000 citizens of western Albemarle County and an area of 184 square miles. This includes the Ivy area, Afton Mountain, and areas north of Whitehall to south of Batesville.

Volunteer Opportunities

The Crozet Volunteer Fire Department is looking for individuals to join our organization to help provide volunteer emergency services to our community. We welcome everyone at the fire house, and there's a capacity in which everyone can contribute.

Active Membership (Firefighters)

Active members are expected to answer emergency calls, participate in a duty crew (one day per week for four hours), and assist with fundraisers, general maintenance, and our Annual Carnival/Festival.

Junior Firefighters

Junior firefighters are comprised of individuals between 16 and 18 years of age. The juniors train to learn the basic fundamentals of firefighting while assisting with fundraising and other fire department functions.

If firefighting isn't for you, consider one of our support volunteer opportunities:

Associate Membership

Associate Members are not expected to engage in emergency calls or firefighting. Associate members assist with support and administrative functions such as helping with fundraisers, general maintenance, and hosting our Annual Carnival/Festival.

Auxiliary Membership

Auxiliary Members assist the fire department by holding special fundraisers and providing refreshments, support, and rehabilitation services at emergency scenes which require long hours, extensive manpower, and significant resources.
