

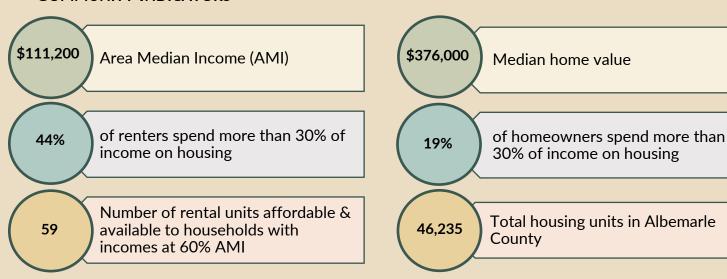

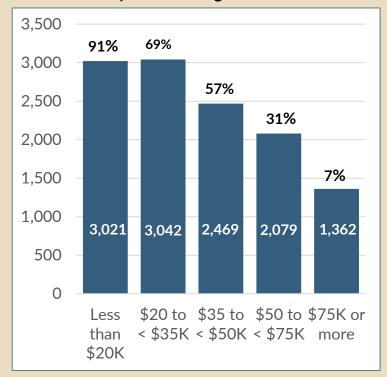
#### **OUR GOAL**

### Number of Housing Units Needed by 2040 by Household Income Level



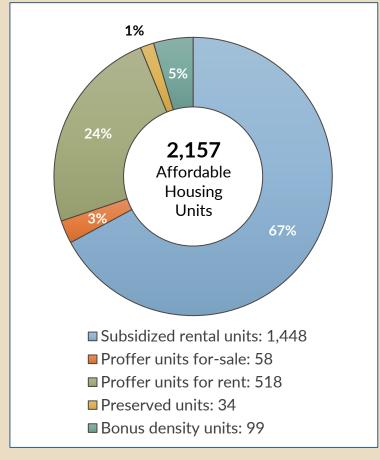
### Median Gross Rents Increased 17% Between 2016 and 2020



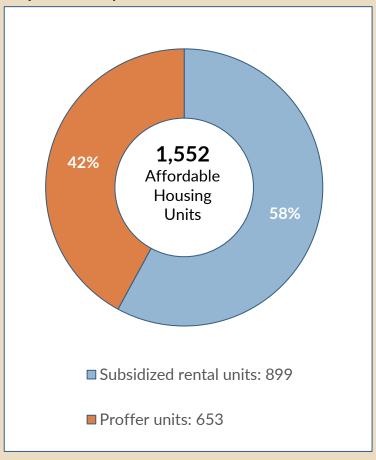
### Median Home Values Increased 18% Between 2016 and 2020

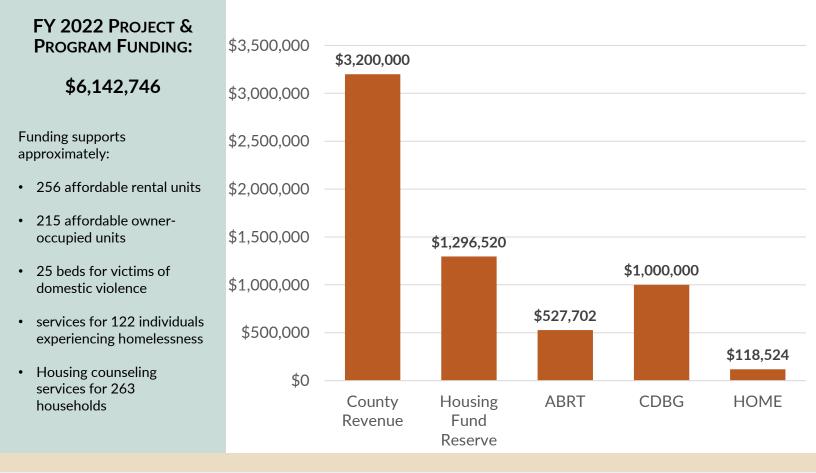


# Number of Subsidized, Proffered, Bonus Density, and Preserved Units - May 2022

#### **Community Indicators:**

- Area median income (AMI) is established for the Charlottesville Metropolitan Statistical Area annually by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The metropolitan area includes the counties of Albemarle, Fluvanna, Greene, and Nelson, and the City of Charlottesville.
- The number of rental units affordable and available to households with incomes at 60% AMI was
  estimated based on an online search of units available for rent in Albemarle County conducted May 12,
  2022.
- All other data points were collected from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey 2016-2020 5-Year Estimates.
- Number & percentages of cost burdened households collected from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey 2016-2020 5-Year Estimates.
- Number of housing units needed by 2040 can be found in the Central Virginia Regional Housing Partnership's 2018 Comprehensive Regional Housing Study and Needs Assessment.
- Median gross rents and median home values were collected from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey 5-year estimates.
