Mr. Walsh established a quorum and called the meeting to order.

Mr. DeLoria announced the following for the record:

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Agenda Item No. 5 Approval of April 26, 2022, Meeting Minutes

Mr. Walsh **moved** to approve the minutes.

Mr. Henry **seconded** the motion.

The motion was approved unanimously.

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Agenda Item No. 6 Old Business

Agenda Item No. 6a VATI 2021 Update

Mr. Inofuentes shared a PowerPoint presentation. (Attached to these minutes)

Mr. Inofuentes introduced Steve Brewer of CenturyLink.

Mr. Brewer stated that they had have had difficulty adding new workers and have been unable to add new contractors. Mr. Brewer noted that existing contractors had been able to add some new works.

Mr. Brewer addressed a recent disruption in service that occurred during installation of fiber. The disruption occurred due to fiber cables being cut. The disruption in service occurred on the 19<sup>th</sup> and has been repaired.

Mr. Jaquith asked how often the cables are cut and aren't the cables located before work begins.

Mr. Brewer stated that the locations are marked prior to the start of work and doesn't know how the cut happened.

Mr. Inofuentes stated that the CenturyLink/Lumen transfer has been approved with a settlement agreement.

Mr. Inofuentes noted that some outages have occurred while the rehabilitation work has been done on the cables.

Mr. Henry recommended that the Board of Supervisors be updated on the settlement agreement and the work to be done.

Mr. Jaquith asked how many people are impacted by the rehabilitation.

Mr. Inofuentes stated that approximately 3,100 connections are impacted.

Agenda Item No. 6b VATI 2022 Update

Mr. Inofuentes shared a PowerPoint presentation. (Attached to these minutes)

Mr. Walsh **moved** the Board of Directors to approve the three-party agreement between this Authority, the Thomas Jefferson Planning District Commission, and Firefly required by the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development to receive 2022 Virginia Telecommunication Initiative grant funding to achieve deployment of a fiber-to-the-premises last-mile broadband network, which will offer service to all locations within Albemarle County and all other participating counties in accordance with the VATI grant program requirements and to authorize the Chair to execute the three-party agreement and other documents needed to participate in the VATI2022 project after such documents are approved as to content and form by the County Attorney.

Mr. Jaquith **seconded** the motion.

Mr. Andrews stated he is in on the Commission for the Thomas Jefferson Planning District Commission and stated that he did not believe that he had a conflict of interest.

Mr. Deloria advised that Mr. Andrews did not have a conflict of interest.

David Blount of the Thomas Jefferson Planning District Commission thanked ABBA for its action and stated his appreciation of the work of Mr. Culp, Mr. Inofuentes and Mr. Deloria. Mr. Blount noted that ABBA is the first locality to approve the three party agreement.

Gary Wood of Central Virginia Electric Cooperative thanked ABBA for supporting the project. Mr. Wood noted that notices to 500 Appalachian Electric Power customers have gone out letting them know of the start of work.

Mr. Wood stated that White Hall is under construction with 65 miles, or 60% of the work in place. Mr. Wood stated that 15 miles of fiber had been installed in just the last week. Mr. Wood noted that the take rate is just under 50% to date.

Mr. Wood stated that Red Hill has a 30% take rate and invitations to sign up have not gone out yet and Midway project has a take rate of over 75%

Mr. Wood noted that they have had 17 cable cuts mostly in the Lake Monticello and Crozet area. Mr. Wood stated that the problem is mismarking the location of the cables. In one case the marking was off by 80 feet. Mr. Wood stated that he does not know if this is because of bad plans, new personnel, or a training issue.

Mr. Jaquith stated that it has taken a huge amount of work to get to this point and it has gone from planning to in place.

Agenda Item No. 6c VATI 2023 Final Guidelines Posted

Mr. Inofuentes shared a PowerPoint presentation. (Attached to these minutes)

Mr. Inofuentes stated that there are no big changes from last year.

Mr. Inofuentes noted that because of our success in previous years there are no longer areas that have speeds of 25/3 which means that it will be more difficult for the County to compete in the statewide grant review.

Mr. Walsh stated that it was hard to believe that 100/20 speeds were not available in these areas.

Mr. Inofuentes stated that reliability is the issue in these areas. They may have faster speeds but not reliable at those speeds.

Mr. Fritz stated that this is a significant issue for development and redevelopment of the county's designated development areas and Places 29 in particular. The provision of broadband in these areas should be discussed during the review of the Comprehensive Plan.

Mr. Inofuentes stated that this work is already underway.

Mr. Inofuentes stated that FCC mapping of unserved areas are due in November. At this time, it is not known how much Virginia will receive.

Agenda Item No. 6d ABBA Financial Report (Appendix A)

Mr. Henry stated that there were no changes from last month. Changes will not happen until VATI 2022 starts billing.

Agenda Item No. 6e Broadband Accessibility and Affordability Report

Mr. Inofuentes shared a PowerPoint presentation. (Attached to these minutes)

Mr. Walsh asked if ABBA can be the authority that provides supplemental payments.

Mr. DeLoria stated that ABBA does not have the authority to provide the payments.

Mr. Fritz asked that further discussion on the topic of supplemental payments be discussed at the next meeting if the Broadband Accessibility and Affordability Office is unable to provide the supplemental payments.

Mr. Inofuentes stated that an update would be provided at the next meeting.

Agenda Item No. 6f Possible return to In-Person Meetings with Virtual Option (Hybrid)

Mr. Henry stated that the return to in-person meetings with virtual option was discussed at the Board of Supervisors last night. The recommendation is to go to hybrid meetings after September 1<sup>st</sup>. The first in-person meeting of ABBA will be the September meeting.

Mr. Walsh stated that the organizational meeting is in August, so the September meeting date is not known.

Mr. Fritz asked if there would be training for ABBA members on how the meetings operation.

Mr. Henry stated that staff and others have training and will be able to participate and support the meetings.

Mr. Inofuentes stated that a mock meeting may be planned.


#### VATI 2021 – Field Report



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



#### VATI 2023 Guidelines

- Definition of Broadband set at 100/20
- Will incorporate IIJA projects, guidelines may be amended to reflect updated NTIA guidance
- No options to serve areas currently served by VATI or other grants
- Shift in scoring towards Commonwealth Priorities
  - Increased focus on digital equity efforts to ensure low to moderate income households in the proposed project area will have affordable access to speeds at or above 100/20 mbps.
- Eighteen-month project timeline
- Notice to apply by July 7, 2022; application due by August 25, 2022

Rental participation will be included.




#### CenturyLink/Lumen update

The SCC approved the transfer of assets on April 27<sup>th</sup>, under the terms of the settlement agreement which mirrored aspects of Lumen's action plan following the January 12<sup>th</sup> BoS Work Session.

This includes a commitment to rehabilitate degraded infrastructure in our area, and increased oversight by the SCC following the transfer.

Per Lumen, as of this time:

- Analysis of 72 cables completed; 67 cables to receive rehabilitation
- 23.61% of work completed
- Work to be completed by July 31, 2022

Will seek a partner organization to grant allocated funds and allow them to administer the program with staff and County support.


