WHAT YOU CAN GAIN FROM VIEW?

VIEW offers you the following opportunities to:

- Work and continue to receive some TANF/TANF-UP benefits and support services.
- Obtain job search/job readiness training.
- Receive education or training while you work.
- Acquire 12 months of transitional services.
- Obtain necessary work experience and work skills.
- Contribute to the selfsufficiency of your family.
- Achieve your economic independence.

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE REQUIREMENTS?

◆ Each individual VIEW participant must participate for at least 35 hours per week, unless full time employed 30 hours per week, including TANF-UP

WHAT ARE MY RESPONSIBILITIES AS A VIEW PARTICIPANT?

You have the responsibility to take advantage of the opportunities in the VIEW program that are available to increase your personal growth and opportunity for employment.

- Recognize that TANF is temporary assistance.
- Participate in all VIEW activity assignments.
- Keep all appointments.
- Ask questions if you do not understand your assignments or instructions.
- Inform your Employment Service Worker (ESW) of any changes which may affect your participation.
- Look for and accept a job.
- Keep a job by practicing good work habits.
- Arrange day care and transportation to allow you to participate.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Recipients of Temporary
Assistance to Needy Families
(TANF) may be eligible.

- The local Department of Social Services (DSS) will contact you if your participation is mandatory.
- Please call your TANF worker if you have any further questions.
