Family Support Workers are knowledgeable about the educational process, how to access a variety of community resources, and are responsive to family needs.

The Family Support Program helps families and children by providing:

Resource Support:

- Collaborate with community resources to help families identify and access necessary resources (Food/Financial/ Housing/Transportation)
- Build self-sufficiency skills

Parental Support:

- Reduce stress in the family
- Enhance the parent-child relationship
- Help families to identify and/or build their support system
- Assist with crisis intervention and problem solving
- Support child's growth and development

School Support:

- Partner with school staff to build home-school connections
- Increase collaboration between the school, home, and community
- Skill building activities with students

Enrichment:

- Activities to promote Family Engagement
- Information regarding afterschool, childcare, summer camps, sports, and other activities
