The Virginia Conservation Assistance Program (VCAP) is a cost-share program for residential or other developed land uses, providing financial, technical, and educational assistance to property owners who install eligible Best Management Practices (BMPs) in Virginia's Chesapeake Bay Watershed. Offers assistance to control erosion, conserve water within the landscape, improve riparian buffer areas, promote native vegetation and wildlife habitats, and treat and control stormwater runoff.
